Assessment Guidance:

This unit is to be undertaken in accordance with current, relevant legislation, procedures and guidance including:

- 1.1 Clay types: Earthenware, Stoneware, Porcelain, Bone China, Paper clay.
- 2.1 Clay preparation includes Wedging, Kneading and Reclaiming.
- 2.2 Three construction methods to be identified could include: coiling, pinching, soft slab, hard slab, throwing, slip casting or molding.
- 3.1 Decorative techniques could include: Sgraffito, Impressing, Inlaying, Sprigging, Carving, Piercing, Burnishing. Could also include adding colour through Engobes, Coloured Slip, mixing clays, Nerikomi, Slip Trailing and Monoprinting.
- 3.2 Glaze techniques could include: Underglazing, Oxides and Stains, Brushing, Dipping, Spraying, Layering, Wax resist, Onglazing and Transfer printing.
